
New/Old Approach to Peacemaking: Little of Justice, Peacebuilding?

In his book *New/Old Approach to Peacemaking: Little of Justice, Peacebuilding?* author John Paul Lederach explores the challenges of peacemaking in the 21st century. 

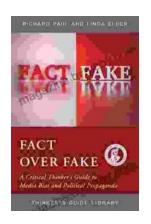
